QUESTIONS**Question 1**

Your form tutor has decided that you can have a class pet. To decide which animal to choose, he has set up a competition.

Whoever writes him the most persuasive letter will win and can choose which animal to have as your class pet!

Write your teacher a letter to persuade them to choose the animal of your choice.

To be successful in this question:

- Show you understand the correct format for writing a letter
- Minimum of 3 paragraphs (use PEA structure - make your point, explain your point, analyse your point)
- Use some persuasive devices
- Demonstrate a clear argument
- Pay attention to spelling, punctuation and grammar throughout
